

Transfer Reason	Description
Extremely Overcrowded	Living in an extremely overcrowded apartment. More than 2 people per bedroom and living room. See reference table for definition of extremely overcrowded. No documentation needed.
Overcrowded	Living in an overcrowded apartment. More than 2 people per bedroom. See reference table for definition of overcrowded. No documentation needed.
Extremely Under occupied	Living in an extremely under-occupied apartment. See reference table for definition of extremely under-occupied. No documentation needed.
Under occupied	Living in an under-occupied apartment. See reference table for definition of under-occupied. No documentation needed.
Long Term Friction w/Neighbors	Long-term friction between neighbors. Requires a Police Report.
Long Travel Time to Work	Required to travel to work more than 90 minutes due to a change in work location. Need an employer letter documenting change in work location.
Requesting Elderly Development	Elderly tenant living in a general population development and wishes to move to an elderly development/building. No documentation needed.
Needs Home Health Care	Needs continuing home health care, which NO household member can provide, and that is not available within 60 minutes travel time from the current development. Requires medical documentation and a transit letter.
Needs an Accessible Apartment	Qualifies for and requests an accessible apartment. Need medical documentation.
Family Member Death	Resides in an apartment in which a family member died. Transfer request must be submitted no later than six months after the death. Requires a copy of the Death Certificate.
Providing Health Care to Relative	Willing to provide continuing home aid to a relative in a different development which NO member of the relative's household can provide, and that is not available within 60 minutes travel time from the relative's development. Requires medical documentation and a transit letter.
Requires Medical Care Close By	Needs continuing health/medical care with a specific health care provider or facility and travel time is more than 60 minutes from current development. Requires medical documentation and a transit letter.

Extra Bedroom Medical	In need of an extra bedroom to accommodate a person with a medical condition that requires use of a hospital bed or accommodates the mental condition of a family member. Requires medical documentation detailing need for extra bedroom.
Disabled and Needs Low Floor	Disabled and wants an apartment on the 1st or 2nd floor in a building with or without an elevator. Requires medical documentation detailing the need for a low floor.
Disabled and Needs Elevator	Disabled in a non-elevator building and wants an apartment in elevator building on any floor. Requires medical documentation.
Victim of Domestic Violence	Victim of a felony or misdemeanor crime of violence committed by a family member, current or former spouse or intimate partner, or person with whom the victim has a child in common, a person is cohabiting or has cohabited with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner, a person similarly situated to a spouse under New York’s domestic or family violence laws, or by a person against a victim protected under New York’s domestic or family violence laws.
Dating Violence	Victim of violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim, based on length and type of relationship and frequency of interaction.
Sexual Assault	Victim of any nonconsensual sexual act proscribed by Federal, tribal, or State law, including when the victim lacks capacity to consent.
Stalking	Victim of a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his/her individual safety or the safety of others or suffer substantial emotional distress.
Intimidated Witness (NYPD)	A tenant or authorized household member is referred by and cooperates with the NYPD in the anticipated arrest and/or prosecution of an individual who committed a crime, and as a result of such cooperation: the NYPD anticipates that (s)he will suffer threat or physical injury once his/her cooperation with law enforcement becomes known to the perpetrator and/or the perpetrator’s associates; and the perpetrator or the perpetrator’s associates know where the tenant or authorized household member lives; and the NYPD anticipates that the tenant or authorized household member will suffer if (s)he continues to live in the current residence.

Intimidated Witness (DA)	A tenant or authorized household member is referred by and cooperates with the N.Y. District Attorney's Office/ NYC Corporation Counsel (if perpetrator is a minor), or U.S. Attorney's Office in the arrest and prosecution of an individual(s) who committed a crime, and as a result of such cooperation: the tenant or authorized household member suffered actual physical injury or the threat of injury against him/herself or immediate family due to cooperation in the arrest and/or prosecution of the perpetrator, and the perpetrator or perpetrator's associates know where the tenant or authorized household member lives; and the tenant or authorized household member will continue to suffer if (s)he continues to live in the current residence.
Intimidated Victim	A tenant or authorized household member who is the victim of a violent crime or the threat of a violent crime and such crime was committed in a non-random manner as a result of a relationship between the victim and the perpetrator, and as a result of such crime: the victim suffered actual physical injury or the threat of injury against him/herself or immediate family, and the victim will continue to suffer if (s)he continues to live in the current residence. To be eligible, the crime must have occurred within the last 12 months of the submission date of the emergency transfer.
Victim of Traumatic Incident	A tenant or authorized household member who is either the victim of a violent felony on development grounds or witnessed a violent felony committed against another household or family member (as defined in Chapter 1, Section XI(B)(2)) on development grounds, and as a result of the violent felony suffered trauma and will continue to suffer if (s)he continues to live in the current residence.
